**A/Professor Habib Bhurawala (PED)** is a Clinical Associate Professor and an experienced General Paediatrician with expertise in various leadership, medical education and clinical roles. He holds the position of Head of Department and Senior Staff Specialist in Paediatrics at the Nepean Hospital. Dr. Bhurawala is also a senior clinical lecturer at the University of Sydney and also a Clinical Associate Professor at the University of Notre Dame, Sydney.



**Professor Thomas J. Hugh (UGI)** Professor Tom Hugh is an Upper Gastrointestinal Surgeon based at Royal North Shore Hospital and North Shore Private Hospital. He specialises in the treatment of patients with gallstones, liver tumours, and abdominal wall and groin hernias.

Professor Hugh is the Chair of Surgery at the Northern Clinical School, University of Sydney, based at Royal North Shore Hospital. He is the founder and Director of the Surgical, Education, Research and Training (SERT) Institute at Royal North Shore Hospital. He is passionate about high-quality, evidence-based clinical care and the training of future surgeons. He undertakes both clinical and laboratory research and currently supervises several PhD and Masters students. He was a co-founder of the RNSH Clinical Skills Centre, currently located within the Sydney Clinical Skills and Simulation Centre, in the Kolling Building, RNSH. He has organised and taught many open and laparoscopic skills courses over the past 20 years.



**Professor Eugenia Pedagogos (NEPHRO)** is an experienced clinician, researcher and leader with over 30 years' experience fostering collaborative relationships in the medical, education and health care sectors.

She is a practicing Nephrologist at Western Health and previously served as a Clinician Researcher at the Royal Melbourne Hospital as well as Medical Director and Director of Medical Innovation and Clinical trials at Epworth HealthCare. Professor Pedagogos is also involved in teaching medical students at the University of Melbourne.



**A/Professor Ajay Sharma (GATRO)** is a leading Australian paediatric gastroenterologist recognised for his clinical expertise, academic leadership, and contributions to improving digestive health outcomes for children. Based in Western Australia, he has played a significant role in developing paediatric gastroenterology services, supporting the diagnosis and management of complex gastrointestinal, liver, and nutritional disorders in infants, children, and adolescents.

Professor Sharma is actively involved in medical education and research, contributing to advancements in paediatric digestive disease management and mentoring the next generation of clinicians. His work spans clinical practice, teaching, and collaboration across multidisciplinary teams to enhance patient care and health system outcomes.



**Professor Fiona Wood (PRS)** is an Australian plastic and reconstructive surgeon internationally recognised for her pioneering work in burns treatment and research. She is Director of the Burns Service of Western Australia and a consultant surgeon at Royal Perth Hospital and Princess Margaret Hospital. Professor Wood co-developed the revolutionary “spray-on skin” technology, a cell-based therapy that significantly improves healing and survival outcomes for burn victims. Her leadership was especially prominent following the 2002 Bali bombings, where her expertise helped save many critically injured patients.

Beyond clinical practice, Professor Wood is an active researcher and educator, contributing extensively to advances in tissue engineering and trauma care. She was named Australian of the Year in 2005 and has received numerous national and international honours recognising her innovation, service to medicine, and dedication to improving patient outcomes.



**Dr Madeleine Adams (OPHTHAL)** is a comprehensive ophthalmologist and covers all aspects of general ophthalmology. Dr Adams works as an ophthalmologist for the Westside Private Hospital, and holds a position as Senior Lecturer at the University of Queensland. She is involved in teaching the next generation of eye doctors, as well as mentoring junior doctors and medical students.

Dr Adams was awarded a PhD by the University of Melbourne for her research into Age Related Macular Degeneration.



**Dr Sid Agarwal (ICU)** is a senior staff specialist in Intensive Care currently based in Brisbane. He has an extensive experience in this field, having worked in Northern Territory and Queensland for last 17 years. Dr Agarwal also has vast experience in working with rural, remote and indigenous communities in NT and QLD.
